### LAUNCH OF TWO NEW BOOKS by JANICE JOHNSON

The late Janice Johnson, who died in 2017, left money for the publishing of several books she had not finished.

One book was *Camden Soldiers of King and Queen 1788 to 1913*, with an account of Camden soldiers involved in all of the conflicts before World War I. Janice told the story of Camden soldiers who arrived as part of a British Regiment and later moved to the Cowpastures, fought as part of the British Empire in India, the Napoleonic wars, Maori wars, Crimean war, Sudan and Boer wars. Janice included Camden soldiers who were involved in the NSW Mounted Rifles and those who participated in Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee contingent.

We were planning a launch of this book at a cocktail party on 20<sup>th</sup> March 2020, when Covid struck and the launch was cancelled. We are now planning to 'launch' the book briefly, at our February general meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> February 2022 before our guest speaker, Clem Davis, that night.

A second book by Janice is *Camden Stories of Service in World War II* which focuses on the servicemen and women who served between 1939 and 1945, and the accounts in the local paper. Our Treasurer, Fletcher Joss, has taken Janice's unfished book through to publication. The book will be launched briefly at our CHS general meeting at 7.30 pm on 9<sup>th</sup> March. The meeting will be at the Civic Centre and after the short business meeting, there will be a presentation by Max Garcia.

The price for each book is \$25, but the special price for buying both is \$40.

The Society is pleased to publish these books as Janice wished.





### ONSLOW MADRAS CALVARY OFFICER'S MESS UNIFORM 1882

The Society is organising a quotation for the cleaning of our Madras Cavalry Uniform on display in the Camden Museum.

The uniform is a Mess Dress Uniform (not a field uniform) There are five items: dark blue trousers with silver stripes; mid blue jacket with silver frogs; red waistcoat with silver facings; cream cummerbund with 4 toggles; and red and silver round forage cap.

The uniform was worn by Major Frank Montgomery Onslow, an officer in the Second Madras Cavalry. The Onslow uniform dates from 1882 and is memorabilia from the Second Anglo-Afghan War between the British forces and the Afghan forces.

The uniform is in good condition for its age but there are some moth holes and tarnishing. (In 2015 the uniform was moved from the plaster model to a museum-approved wire mannequin, as the seam at the back of the jacket was under stress.)

John and Julie Wrigley are taking this uniform to Rahila Merchant at International Conservation Services in Chatswood to be assessed.

# The Camden Historical Society

The society was founded in 1957. Its aim is to promote the local history and heritage of Camden. It primarily does this through managing the Camden Museum which opened in 1970. General admission to the museum is free, although visitors are encouraged to leave a donation. The museum is conducted entirely by volunteers. It also receives substantial and continuing assistance from Camden Council.

#### Historic Precinct

The museum is located in Camden's historic precinct. It is part of the Camden Library Museum Complex. It provides an ideal start for a walking tour of the town area where the visitor can observe the charm and character of the town centre.

#### Research

The Society's archives are open to the public. General enquiries are free. Specific research by our volunteers attracts a \$15 fee plus photocopying. Extensive use of the Society's records is by negotiation.

All donations to the Camden Historical Society Inc over \$2 are tax deductible. The accredited value of objects donated to the society are eligible for tax deduction.
