Ms VALERIE LHUEDE AM TURNS 100



I would like to let members know that a pioneer and great character of our region and our nation, Ms Valerie Lhuede AM, turned 100 on 1st July. Val Lhuede (pronounced 'lew-weddy') will be remembered because she almost single-handedly saved the historic town of Yerranderie from a mining company, with the compensation her family received when their land and the access was drowned under Lake Burragorang to form the Sydney Water catchment of Warragamba Dam. Ms Lhuede and a small group of locals dedicated their lives to maintaining the heritage and preserving the old buildings.

In March 2011 Val arranged for Yerranderie to become part of the national park system under the National Parks and Wildlife Service, with conditions she set for Yerranderie's future. The natural beauty and outstanding social history features are now saved for future generations to enjoy. Val had to show great determination and patience to bring about this success. TALK - MICHELLE ROFFE - 14 JUNE

Michelle has been a funeral service director for 40 years, and gave a very interesting talk.

She explained the problems with pre-paid funerals which tie the person involved to the particular funeral director.

She recommended funeral bonds as the safest procedure and did not recommend funeral insurance. Pre-arranged funerals are a good way of planning what the person wants and Profile Books are a good way of recording the person's wishes.

Michelle said the funeral industry is not regulated and contractors can sell cheap arrangements but not provide the full service. She urged members to ask questions and make sure we are doing what the departed person wished.

Michelle was supported by a talk from Lauren Newcombe, a solicitor from Family Focus Legal, on estate documents: including Wills, Power of Attorney, Enduring Guardianship, Advanced Care Directives and other processes to do with wills and estate planning. Lauren's colleague, Anneliese Munro, gave advice about superannuation.

A lively question and answer session followed the talks.



TALK - BRUCE DENISON - 12 JULY

Bruce Denison told selected tales from his life. Bruce was born in Paddington, grew up in Surrey Hills and was in the Army reserve, retiring as a squadron Sergeant Major. After he retired, he worked with Army Cadets, and been involved with the local RSL. He donated a field kitchen to the Museum.

The Camden Historical Society

The society was founded in 1957. Its aim is to promote the local history and heritage of Camden. It primarily does this through managing the Camden Museum which opened in 1970. General admission to the museum is free, although visitors are encouraged to leave a donation. The museum is conducted entirely by volunteers. It also receives substantial and continuing assistance from Camden Council.

Historic Precinct

The museum is located in Camden's historic precinct. It is part of the Camden Library Museum Complex. It provides an ideal start for a walking tour of the town area where the visitor can observe the charm and character of the town centre.

Research

The Society's archives are open to the public. General enquiries are free. Specific research by our volunteers attracts a \$15 fee plus photocopying. Extensive use of the Society's records is by negotiation.

All donations to the Camden Historical Society Inc over \$2 are tax deductible. The accredited value of objects donated to the society are eligible for tax deduction.
